Emma is the author of highly acclaimed book club fiction novels and is known for mixing humour with darker emotional themes. Her debut, 'The Songs of Us', was snapped up in multiple pre-empts and auctions and was short-listed for the RNA contemporary novel of the year award. Her work has since been translated into seven different languages.

Writing came to Emma later in life. As a mother of four, she had little spare time and wrote her debut during her lunch hour while working full-time. She went on to run her own successful manuscript appraisal service, where she has worked with traditionally published authors, as well as new aspiring writers.

Emma is a passionate advocate for working-class writers and loves to help others on their road to publication. She has had four books published so far: The Songs of Us, 'The First Time I Saw You', 'If I Could Say Goodbye' and 'It Was Always You' Emma is currently working on her fifth novel, as well as working as a creative writing tutor and mentor.

Anna Vaught

Anna Vaught is an English teacher, mentor and author of several books, including 2020's novel 'Saving Lucia' and short fiction collection, 'Famished', 2023 saw 'Saving Lucia' published to national acclaim in Italy as 'Bang Bang Mussolini', memoir 'These Envoys of Beauty' and the magical realism novel 'The Zebra and Lord Jones', her first teaching book, 'The Alchemy', plus the Curae anthology of short prose from the winning entrants to the prize she established in 2023 for writer-carers. Next year sees her first essay collection, 'To Melt the Stars'. Anna's shorter and multi-genre works are widely published in journals, magazines and anthologies. She has been a columnist for Mslevia and The Roykseller.

With a background in secondary English, mentoring with young people and community arts, Anna is now a guest university lecturer, tutor for Jericho Writers and teaches occasionally at secondary level. She works alongside chronic illness and is a passionate campaigner for mental health provision and SEND support for young people.

She is a PhD candidate at York St John from December 2023-24, undertaking a PhD by Published Works on Magical Realism and Trauma, foregrounding her own work. Her title begins with a quotation from her memoir: 'Go there on a wing in your imagination: Magical Realism and imagination as therapeutic writing in Saving Lucia and These Envoys of Beauty.' She is currently writing an extended nonfiction study, 'A Cultural and Emotional History of Lipstick', and completing a new novel, 'All the Days I did not Live'.

She is particularly sympathetic to writers working alongside significant additional challenges in whatever form and is passionate about all elements of access - for example for writers who are dyslexic or dyspraxic.

Your year at a glance

Each month you'll get a one-to-one feedback session with your Personal Tutor, four online tutorials and a webinar with a top author on that month's topic, plus weekly exercises with peer-to-peer feedback. Every Tutor Group will also have two workshop calls each month.*

April: Planning Your Novel

It's important to have a good outline of your novel's structure and plot before getting started. This month, we'll learn how to plan and structure your novel, then put this into action for your own work.

Outcome: Perfect your pitch, get to grips with your plot, and make sure you have a sound structure

Bonus: Introductory video call with tutors and fellow students.

May: Point of View

How is your novel told? Have you thought about trying out different perspectives, different viewpoints? We'll explore all the different kinds of points of view, from omniscient to first person, and see how each one can inform our own work.

Outcome: Through learning the benefits and experimenting with different points of view, you'll perfect your narrator's voice to enhance and enrich your novel.

*Please note, there will not be any one-to-one sessions or group calls in the final month, which is devoted to the networking events.



June: Setting

It's time to start writing your novel. This month, we'll look at how you can maximise the potential of your setting - whether it's a colony on Mars or a suburban living room.

Outcome: Through understanding the importance of setting, you'll create a world that the reader believes, giving your text weight, authority, and atmosphere.

July: Character

This month, you'll learn techniques and tools you can use to strengthen and develop your characters, and how you can ensure that their development links closely to the plot.

Outcome: By the end of the month, you'll have the tools you need to create three-dimensional characters that your readers will fall in love with (or hate, if that's your intention!).

Bonus guest tutor session: Join award-winning author, Yvonne Battle Felton, for a special guest webinar exploring how to perfect your characters.





August: Emotions and Senses

Study the art of transferring weight of emotion onto objects and atmosphere. We'll be looking at short sections of your writing, and how to apply the technique throughout your manuscript.

Outcome: This month will include close paragraph work that will guide you through expressing senses and emotions through your writing.

September: Pacing and Tension

How do you keep your reader engaged? We'll discover the importance of building tension, no matter the genre.

Outcome: This month, you'll look at how events and situations can be engineered to leave your readers wanting more.

October: Voice and Style

This is what can really set your work apart from the rest. A well-developed style is like a fingerprint: what can you do to practice yours and make your words flow?

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November: Writing a Great Ending

By now, you'll have a working manuscript and be aware of all the techniques you can use to shape your world. But does it work? We'll look closely at the plausibility and credibility of your story.

December: Self-Editing

This month, we'll look at your manuscript in its entirety and learn how to turn that first draft into a masterpiece.

Outcome: Through self-editing tips and tricks, you'll learn how to always view your work with a critical eye.

Application deadline: 3 March 2024

To apply for the course please follow these steps:

- 1. Please fill in the application form on our website telling us about you, your writing and your writing goals.
- You will also be asked to upload a 1,500 word sample of your work from either your current writing project or a previous creative piece.
- 3. Select the course package that would best suit you FULL or CORE.
- 4. Click submit!

All applicants will receive our decision within 15 working days of applying.

We welcome students from around the world, but please note that all calls will take place at GMT/BST and EST. All calls will be recorded if you can't make it on that occasion, so you can catch up at a time that suits you.
